CAITHNESS ARTS FESTIVAL

Following the disappointing outcome of the SAC funding application, Caithness Arts recently applied to several other funding bodies for financial assistance for this year's Festival. We are grateful to the Dounreay Communities Fund for awarding us a percentage of our request which will go towards the Festival programme.

Unfortunately, due to a large demand for financial assistance, we have been unable to secure funding through other applications. We are currently pursuing other avenues. The Board will meet in July to decide the structure of this year's Festival.

VRSG NEWS

Caithness Arts is a member of the **Viewfirth Redevelopment Steering Group** (VRSG) which was set up in December 2006 to exploit the opportunity offered by the UKAEA who are planning to demolish the existing Viewfirth building and offer the site to the people of Caithness for a community purpose.

A proposal has been sent to the Dounreay Stakeholder Group based on the findings of our public consultation and we are currently awaiting a response.

CAITHNESS ARTS FORUM

A meeting of the Caithness Arts Forum took place on the 15th May and took the form of workshops providing an opportunity to discuss the Caithness Arts Strategy document.

It was agreed that the membership of the Forum be expanded to include two individual members (Jenny Bruce and David Morrison), David Brookfield, Director of Pentland Housing Association, Donald MacBeath of North Highland College/UHI, and Highland Councillors Willie Mackay and Donnie Mackay. Lord MacLennan has been confirmed as the Chair of the Arts Forum. The next meeting is scheduled for late August/early September.

RSAMD MASTERCLASSES

The **RSAMD** is bringing to Caithness for two days, Monday and Tuesday 6th and 7th of August, six of its top vocal music students and their teachers for three events in Thurso.

On the evening of Monday 6th August a public Master Class for the students will be held by Patricia MacLaughlin, the distinguished Scottish teacher of Singing, in St Anne's RC Church, Thurso.

The following evening, 7th August, also at St Anne's, there will be an opera recital given by the Student Singers under the direction of Chris Underwood, head of Vocal Music at the RSAMD.

Chris Underwood is also offering to provide a Master Class for singers from Caithness at St. Anne's on the afternoon of Monday, 6th August, from 2.30 – 5.30 pm.

The events are sponsored by the North Highland Initiative and HIE Caithness and Sutherland.

TELFORD LADE PROJECT

Following on the success of the Telford Mill Lade Walk in September 2006 as part of the Caithness Arts Festival, a group was set up to take the project further and as part of the Royal Burgh of Wick Community Council plans, redevelopment of the Telford Mill Lade has been included in the Wick Pathways Project and a sub group set up to improve the walkway and the surrounding environment.

Pulteneytown Distillery has already pledged to clean, repair and maintain the water course with work commencing June 2007. They have also agreed to fund informative panels which will include the work of the South School pupils on the heritage of the Town and nature study of the area. Caithness Archaeological Trust have also given their approval as Thomas Telford's engineering work on the Lade is of particular importance, not only to Wick and Caithness but nationally, and a special asset of industrial archaeology in Caithness.

Likewise, other interested bodies are the Highland Council Countryside Rangers, Core Access Pathways and the Institute of Civil Engineering who published a report by local artist Jenny Bruce in their historical newsletter.

A second walk has been included in the Scottish Archaeology Month's programme of events for the 22nd September, meeting at Wick Railway Station at 10am going on to Toftcarl, Hempriggs. Enquiries: Jenny Bruce, 01955 603380.




